#### 1. Read the following text.

(10 marks)

- 1. Archaeology may conjure up images of ancient ruins or elusive treasures. But large-scale digs that excavate foundations of buried cities are a small fraction of archaeological projects. In 2010, as a construction crew began to tear up sidewalks in New York City's South Street Seaport to replace a water pipe, Alyssa Loorya and her team watched eagerly, picks and brushes in hand. Loorya, an urban archaeologist, leads Chrysalis Archaeology, a firm at the forefront of uncovering the remnants of history in the New York metro area.
- 2. Any New York City construction project using municipal funds is required to consider whether historical artefacts will be affected during construction, and if that possibility exists, an urban archaeologist must be consulted. Since the South Street Seaport area was a bustling commercial centre for early colonists, Loorya anticipated that a rich history lay beneath the pavement. "It's our job to document and recover that history before it's lost," she said.
- 3. As the work continued, therefore, the team faced obstacles. Fieldwork in a city has to be done intermittently: the construction crew had to proceed one block at a time to avoid interrupting traffic, and the archaeological team's work was periodically halted—at times, by stormy weather or by the discovery of toxic materials underground. Moreover, as archaeologists underground attempted to relay information to those at the surface, they had to contend with the noise of construction vehicles, car horns, and pedestrians' noise on the busy New York City streets.
- 4. Despite these setbacks, Loorya and her team eventually began to uncover some interesting artefacts. In 2012, the team discovered a foundation wall, a network of wooden pipes, and several well bases dating back to the eighteenth century. In August 2013, the archaeologists discovered thousands of objects in a single fifteen-foot stretch that was likely a garbage disposal site. These objects included buttons from Revolutionary War uniforms, clay pipes, and an imported mineral water bottle from Germany.
- 5. As they cleaned and catalogued the artefacts, the archaeologists took stock of their findings. The team's discoveries provided a snapshot of the various kinds of construction materials that were used in the eighteenth century. Colonial-era New Yorkers went to

great lengths to secure fresh drinking water, Loorya noted, given the effort involved in laying wooden pipes to bring in fresh water from surrounding areas, digging very deep wells, efforts to mask the water's salty taste, and even importing bottled water. Through such discoveries, they tell the story of a city's history in a new way. "One of my favourite things is putting together someone's life," Loorya said.

The future of billboards is dynamic and full of possibilities, thanks to the innovative integration of AI technology.
