

- Unsafe water kilkmore people each year than do war and other forms of violence combined. Meanwhile, our drinkable water sources are finite, less than 1% of the Earth's freshwater is accessible to us. Without action, the challenges will only increase by 2050, when global demand for fresh water is expected to be 1/3 greater than it is now.
- Water is uniquely vulnerable to pollution. Known as a 'universal solvent', water is able to dissolve more substances than any other liquid on Earth. Water pollution is the release of substances into subsurface groundwater or into lakes, streams, rivers, estuaries and oceans to the point where the substances interfere with beneficial use of water or with natural functioning of ecosystem. In addition to the release of substances, such as chemicals, trash or microorganisms, water pollution may also include the release of energy in the form of radioactivity or heat into bodies of



water. The key causatives of water pollution in India are urbanization, deforestation, Industrial effluents and agricultural runoffs with the use of insecticides and pesticides. The other causes are social and religious offerings in water bodies and the use of detergents and fertilizers.

- (3) Water pollution can have disastrous consequences on the ecosystem. Furthermore, toxic chemicals can travel through the food chain and get into our bodies, causing diseases and deaths.
- (4) There is no single or simple answer to stop the water pollution crisis. However, there are many solutions to prevent water pollution both in our daily lives and within industries. They are wastewater treatment, reducing plastic waste and water conservation, In addition to this, we must have water-efficient toilets, Storm water management and ozone wastewater treatment.




