- 1. Read the following passage:
 - (1) 'Sarcasm is the lowest form of wit but the highest form of intelligence wrote that connoisseur of wit, Oscar Wilde. Whether sarcasm is a sign of intelligence or not we are not sure as communication experts and marriage counsel alike typically advise us to stay away from this particular form of expression.
 - (2) The reason is simple: sarcasm expresses the poisonous sting of contempt hurting others and harming relationships. As a form of communication, sarcasm takes on debt of conflict. And yet, our research suggests, there may also be some unexpected benefits from sarcasm like greater creativity.
 - (3) The use of sarcasm in fact, promotes creativity for those on both the giving and receiving of sarcastic exchanges. Instead of avoiding sarcasm

completely in office research suggests, sarcasm if used with care and moderation, can effectively trigger creative sparks. Sarcasm involves constructing or exposing contradiction between intended meanings. The most common form of verbal irony, sarcasm often used to humorously convey thinly veiled disapproval or scorn "pat, don't work so hard!" a boss might say upon catching his assistant surfing the internet.

Early research on sarcasm explored how people's statement sound more (4) critical. Participants related sarcasm more condemning than literal statements. When might sarcasm enhance creativity? Because the brain must think creatively to understand or convey a sarcastic comment sarcasm may lead to clearer and more creative thinking to either create the literal or actual meanings of the sarcastic expressions. This is a process that activates and is facilitated by, abstraction, which in turn promotes creative thinking. Consider the following example, which comes from a conversation one of my friends had a few weeks before getting married. His fiancee pestered him for a wedding in the next month - May, which was quite expensive. Adar responded with some ideas of his own. "why don't we get Paul McCartney to sing, Barak Obama to give a benediction and Amy Schumer to entertain people." His comment required his fiancee to recognize that there is a distinction between the surface-level meaning of the sentence and the meaning that was intended.



- 2. Read the following passage:
 - (1) There are numerous factors affecting job performance. These can be divided into external and internal factors. The internal factors are team spirit, competent boss, respect from colleagues and job satisfaction. The external factors are chance for personal development, job security, promotion prospects and monetary incentives. The decisive determinant is that the employees remain highly motivated. One possible method to increase motivation is the salary. Employees are willing to stay longer hours in the office and perform better, when they have the chance to get financial rewards, for instance, a higher salary or bonuses.
 - (2) The bar graph shows the result of a survey conducted among workers in a company to analyse their work performance across ten different factors that contribute to make their work environment pleasant. The workers are grouped into two categories—those between the ages of 18-30 and those between 40-60. Interestingly, in six out of the ten factors surveyed, the 18-30 age group is shown to be more affected than the 45-60 age group. Factors, beside the salary, which affect the work performance of the two different age groups are interesting. The factors are the chance for personal development, relaxed working environment; promotion prospects, job satisfaction and monetary incentives. Furthermore, two

out of the remaining four factors namely, team spirit and work environment have been equally influential among the two groups. The 45-60 years workers are impacted a lot by 'respect from colleagues' whereas the prospect of a promotion is an important reason that drives younger employees to work better.

(3) Job performance of happy employees is 31% more productive and they show three times more creativity than their unhappy counterparts. They are more resilient and more likely to stay in the same company for a longer period. Consequently, they drive the company towards long - term goals by being more productive and efficient.
