- (1) They were once everywhere. Chirping and flapping their wings at the window sills, on top of cupboards, and on the branches of trees? Where have all the little sparrows gone? This is most frequently asked question about sparrows these days.
- (2) The association between humans and house sparrows dates back to several centuries and no other bird has been associated with humans on a daily basis like the house sparrow. It is a bird that evokes fond memories of childhood. The nests of sparrows dotted almost every where in the neighbourhood as well as public places like in the neighbourhood as well as public places like bus stands and railway stations, where they lived in colonies and survived food grains and tiny worms.
- 3) A study conducted by the Andhra University, Vishakhapatnam, highlighted the fact that the population of sparrows had fallen by over 60% even in the rural areas of coastal Andhra Pradesh. A survey conducted by the British Trust for Ornithology showed that the house sparrow's population in Britain has declined by about 58% since 1970.
- 4) Certainly, there is no single reason for the decline of the house sparrows. Mobile tower radiation and excessive use of chemical fertilisers are aggravating the problem and have been identified as potent sparrow killers.
- 5) It is said that sparrow chicks, which require insect food for their survival in their earth days, have not been getting adequate supply from their parents. This has triggered large scale death of chicks, leading to a gradual decline in their population.
- 6) Urban landscape too, has been dramatically altered over the years. No longer are sparrows able to find the tiny nooks, crannies and holes where they used to build their nests.

- 7) Typically, sparrows were never an issue of concern for us with their diminutive presence in our household. Perhaps, it is this diminutive presence because of which even their gradual disappearance has gone unnoticed. Mohammed Dilawar is rightly called the sparrow man of India as he has been successful in drawing the attention of the world towards the declining number of house sparrows

  - 1. Everyday we are confronted with a barrage of choice. We make choice about the clothes we wear, the food we eat, the appointments we schedule, the people we meet, the time we turn up to work, which bus we catch, where we sit on the bus, what we do after work, and so on. Living a rich and satisfying life means making good choices on an ongoing basis.
  - 2. What is a good choice? Good choices are decisions that good keep you heating in the direction in which you want to go. Bad choices, on the other hand, end up being counterproductive and can quickly begin spiralling into stress, confusion and despair
  - Some of the trickiness of choice-making arises with options that may be jealous in the short term but incrementally steer us off course over the longer term. Just taking that one extra serving of dessert or staying in bed for only half an hour more can be choices like this. Conversely, some decisions can be a bit dreary or difficult at the time but lead to better directions down the track. Staying home and studying or completing another gruelling session at the gym are examples of short-term discomfort for longer term benefits.
  - 4. Perhaps the most fundamental consideration with choice-making is to ensure the choices you make are congruent with important goals you have. If you have a quiet, distant goal of being financially independent one day and building a successful career, then making decision to party excessively with late nights will likely led to later discontent and misery regardless to how good it all feels now : Perhaps the partying is related to an important goal of being accepted and liked by others but is at odds with career and financial goals.
  - 5. Understanding the dynamics of choices can help improve the decisions that you make Essentially, any choice involves at least two options, both of which have prose and cons associated with them. Taking a moment to reflect on your inclinations and wishes that made you hesitate or go ahead with the choice can help you understand the situation more clearly. From this perspective, you'll be able to make a more informed decision.
  - Whenever you find yourself pausing over a choice you're about to make, consider both options in some detail and find the important aspects of them. Pay attention to more highly valued goals that you might become aware of as you're considering your options. If
